its Summer Academy, an opportunity for educators to enroll in graduate-level workshops and earn college credit. These hours may be applied to license renewal

In addition to getting up to two semester hours of college credit in four days, the partnership between the ESC and Ashland University offers a convenient way for teachers to attend a workshop locally. In addition, these courses are aligned to the needs and focus of the work being performed in Pickaway County's schools.

This year's courses are ASD Strategies and Models, offered June 12 and 13, and Google Education Tools, offered June 15 and 16.


ADS Strategies and Models will be taught by Brenda Smith Myles of OCALI. The course will focus on simple strategies that work for students across the spectrum and the Ziggurat framework will be discussed.

Tammera Laughlin, media specialist at Circleville Elementary School and a Google certified instructor, will lead the Google program, showing participants how to set up a classroom, make assignments and use the Google apps.

The Summer Academy is a great way to increase or sharpen your skills and get high-quality professional development. As educators, it's important to stay abreast of current and best practices and the Summer Academy offers an opportunity for that.
